




5. The following menu screen should load. Go to Email Setup.




6. On this you can setup SMTP email server. The server must use simple username and password authentication. (Note: The Red Lion does not support TLS/SSL)

 - b. Press the button marked "Load Default Setup"




- c. The following settings should be loaded.




- d. You can “tap” on any field to change the data. Tap once to high selection, and then tap again to bring up the key pad. The following screens show how to get around the Key Pad.






